Our next topic is going to be "Dinosaurs' so if you have any sources of information we could use we would appreciate being able to borrow them and we promise to always take very good care of them.


All the children have been practising writing their name and now some of them are able to do this unassisted. We are so proud of all the work the children have been doing.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Cherry Cornflake Crisps

INGREDIENTS

- 90g butter
- 1/3 cup caster sugar
- 1 tbs honey
- 4 cups Cornflakes
- 1/3 chopped glace cherries

METHOD

Melt butter with sugar and honey in a small saucepan until frothy. Place cornflakes into a large mixing bowl. Pour over butter mixture. Mix well. Spoon into paper patty cases arranged on baking trays. Sprinkle liberally with cherries. Bake in a slow oven 150°c for 10 minutes or until beginning to brown. Allow to cool. Store in an airtight container.

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
