Young Mums' Group

Our Support Worker Albertha, runs our HUB Program. This program is aimed at assisting families and individuals with life issues.

Ally runs a Young Mums' group every week. One week is taking parents with their children up to the Smith Family playgroup which is located on the Murgon State School campus where they can sit and read stories, play games and interact more with their children.

These activities aim to support young mums in developing and strengthening parenting skills.



Activities also include scrap booking and basic courses such as financial management, computer courses and basic health.

Another part of the young mums program involves fortnightly tiny tot swimming lessons. These lessons are taught by a fully qualified instructor and give the children skills that they will carry with them throughout their lives. And importantly this is very precious time for Mums and their bubs.
